

Scott Family Pavilion

Project Scope:

Construct a state-of-the-art facility for Duke Olympic sports, athletic retail and athletic event ticketing adjacent to Cameron Plaza. The new pavilion will complement the Murray building by adding contiguous DUAA administrative office space and establishing a strong, coherent architectural presence opposite the south entrance of Cameron Indoor Stadium.



Program:

The proposed pavilion will incorporate administrative and game-day functions along with facilities to serve student-athletes. The lowest level of the pavilion will house 11,000 NSF of space for athletic strength and conditioning. The first level above grade, accessible from Cameron Plaza, will host Duke Athletics retail space, event ticketing windows and space for the Ticketing, Marketing, and Compliance offices.

The top level will house 10,000 NSF of office space for Sports Information, Development, and administrative functions. The second level of Murray will be renovated to house 9,000 NSF of Sports Medicine space.

Architecture & Engineering:

A feasibility study was completed by Beck Architecture to examine programming possibilities and massing options within the context of the Duke Master Plan. The feasibility study identified an opportunity to define the southern edge of Cameron Plaza with a two-story high glazed façade opposite the south entrance to Cameron Indoor Stadium. The building will be an integral part of the built “fabric” of the Athletics precinct, and will foreground the planned Wallace Wade press tower on the approach from West Campus. The architectural design of the new pavilion will complement Cameron Indoor Stadium by helping to define an entry plaza for both Cameron and the North Gate of Wallace Wade Stadium.

Site/Location:

The site is located north of the Murray building, fronting the south side of Cameron Plaza. The new pavilion will be at the epicenter of game day activity related to football and basketball games.
